Heifer International

Do you know what a heifer is? It is a young cow that has not given birth to a calf. It is a dairy cow that can produce up to four gallons of milk a day.

Heifer International is an organization that works to end world hunger. For more than 60 years, Heifer International has helped over seven million impoverished families in 128 countries get out of poverty and achieve self-reliance. How do they do this? Heifer provides a “living loan” of an animal to families living in poverty. The family’s health and standard of living is greatly improved by what the animal can provide. For example: milk from cows or goats, eggs from chickens, meat from rabbits, draft power from water buffalo and wool from llamas.

Heifer International not only provides the animals, it also provides training in animal care, agriculture practices and community development. Its goal is to improve the conditions for families, the environment and the community. Heifer currently provides more than 27 types of animals that provide food and/or income to struggling families in 48 countries (including the USA).

Another important part of Heifer International is the “passing on the gift.” Families who receive an animal repay the “living loan” by passing on one or more of the animal’s female offspring to other needy families. That family then passes on a female offspring from their gift to another family and so on. Therefore, one gift multiplies through the community.

Dan West, an American Farmer, started the organization with the philosophy of “Give a man a fish; you have fed him for today. Teach a man to fish; you have fed him for a lifetime.” Heifer International works to ensure that the gift of each animal will eventually help an entire community to become self-sustaining. Animals such as goats, water buffalo and camels are “seven M” animals: they provide meat, milk, muscle, manure, money, materials and motivation.

Heifer International is mainly funded by alternative giving. Donors may purchase “shares” of a gift or pay for an entire animal. Heifer raises funds from chapters organized around schools, colleges and churches. The organization also offers a “wedding registry” in which engaged couples can register for gifts to Heifer instead of traditional wedding presents. People can also go on online and buy a gift that will help children and families around the world receive training and animal gifts that will help them become self-reliant.

So, the next time you need to buy a gift for a friend or relative, how about purchasing a cow or a “share” of a cow. You’ll be giving a meaningful and helpful gift.
